Life Group Study Notes

Study based on Luke 18:9-14 - November 27, 2016

Is there a general posture to prayer? Is there a script, a time of day, or even a liturgy that gains the ear of God more than others? We naturally want our prayers to be answered, but could there be a priority to what God hears?

In this message Jesus once again uses a story to stress the importance of our posture in prayer.

The posture that Jesus stresses though, is not one of position or structure, but a posture of the heart.



Study – Discovering What the Bible Says?

Read Luke 18:9-14

- 1. Can you, in one sentence, summarize the teaching of last week's study or sermon?
- 2. The opening verse targets a common human failing, one that is at the heart of bias and bigotry. Why does religion tend to encourage a judgmental spirit?
- 3. How does a spirit of comparison foster an inappropriate attitude towards others?

- 4. How would you define righteous living?
- 5. Why is it important to understand the cultural background of this story, especially as it relates to the Pharisee and Tax Collector?
- 6. Was the Pharisee a typical representation of the group, or was there something more to him?
- 7. If Jesus told this story today for our culture, who (or what groups) would replace the Pharisee and Tax Collector?
